1. Call to Order 3:00pm

2. Election of Officers

Heath nominated Collins as Chair; seconded by Tarango. Collins nominated Heath as Vice Chair; seconded by Targano. Motion passes to approve reappointment of officers.

3. Approval of Minutes February 2, 2024

4. Review of Passenger Rail Station Site Selection Study

Noffsinger gave an update on the Study with recommendations from the Technical Committee. No action is need for this item.

5. STP-U and High Plains RR Overpass Scope and Fee.pdf

Noffsinger gave an update on the sequencing list from 2020. Cost estimates from Pickett: \$9.82 million for US30, Whitney, Dell Range Blvd grading plans. \$11 million for Converse Dr. Bennett: We just had our kickoff meeting, so I don't have any construction costs. Policy Committee would like to revise STP-U project sequence list for FY 2025 to have the High Plains RR overpass 30% design plans as item #1. Item tabled for more information to be presented at the next meeting.

- 6. Director's Report
 - EV Charging Infrastructure Site Selection Study

Noffsinger gave an update on the study. Yaney will be going to the EV summit next week.

In-House Proposals - Parsley/Wallick Corridor Plan, East Allison Corridor Plan

Noffsinger gave an update on East Allison. Yaney has done some preliminary work on this. Parsley/Wallick: we would like to firm up alignments and work in-house on this in conjunction with an Engineering Firm. The consensus of the committee was to begin the studies.

■ Grant Application - SS4A Grant – Comprehensive Safety Action Plan Noffsinger gave an update on applying for this grant. There is a 20% grant match for this. If we received the initial grant funds that opens us up to a lot of additional funding. The deadline for this is April 9th. Smith: We would have to sign a letter of commitment. The consensus of the committee was to move forward with the grant application.

Southwest Drive Corridor Plan

Noffsinger presented a quick overview of the completed plan.

Collins: The alignment is Broken Arrow?

Noffsinger: Yes, this pushes the intersection with College further away from the interchange.

Collins: Is there enough right of way?

Noffsinger: We will eventually need to acquire additional right of way.

Noffsinger will be presenting to the Planning Commissions and governing bodies for

approval.

FRA Long Distance Service Study

Noffsinger gave an update on the workshop he attended in Seattle. There is the possibility of Cheyenne being a stop for three proposed Amtrak routes.

7. Amendment of UPWP FY 24

Noffsinger gave an update. Increasing the Passenger Rail Site selection from \$33,000 to \$198,000, remove Section 20 and High Plains Railroad Overpass from consideration, and the reallocation of funds for a few in-house projects from \$23,000 to \$173,000. Motion to approve by Heath; seconded by Tarango. Motion Passes.

MOU for the Front Range Passenger Rail came in Monday, reviewed by Stefanie Boster. Motion to approve by Tarango; seconded by Heath. Motion Passes.
